



STATE HCV MEDICAID POLICIES²

HCV Medicaid Policy Provision	Status
Liver damage restrictions	Tennessee Fee-For-Service (FFS) and Managed Care Organizations (MCOs) require at least moderate liver damage (F2 or greater).
Sobriety restrictions	Tennessee FFS and MCOs require six months sobriety for beneficiaries with a history of alcohol or substance use and confirmation that the beneficiary is either enrolled in or has completed a recovery program, or is receiving counseling.


HEPATITIS C AND OPIOID INJECTION ROSE DRAMATICALLY IN YOUNGER AMERICANS FROM 2004-2014
