

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

Liver damage restrictions	Fee-For Service (FFS) and Managed Care Organizations (MCOs) do not have liver damage restrictions
Sobriety restrictions	FFS and MCOs require beneficiaries to be evaluated for current substance or alcohol use. Those identified with alcohol or substance use should be referred for treatment. Prior authorization (PA) forms state explicitly that a patient can't be denied treatment for the sole reason of substance use.
