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

In Fiscal Year 2019:


- Distributed 2,648 kits
- Served 1,374 unique clients

In October 2019, kit distribution increased from 1 to 5 kits per client visit

Began distribution at MCDC. As 12/10/2019, distributed 155 kits.

2019 Client Survey // Initial Data

Methamphetamine use among survey participants has almost doubled from 49% in 2011 to 93% in 2019. Heroin use dropped 11% during the same time period.
