


04 Overall Project Goal



HCV Cure & Wellness with patients with cirrhosis

• Ongoing management - scan every 6 months for a lifetime



<u>Wellness & Support - HCV & PWUD</u>

HCV Cure & Wellness for people who use drugs

- Prevention of reinfection & exposure
 - HCV prevention = HIV prevention
 - HIV prevention \ HCV prevention
- Harm reduction strategies
- Testing frequency

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

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


